LOVE146

10-Year Anniversary - Liturgy

We asked a few of our friends within the Faith Community Network to help us create a worship service that pastors might use on a Sunday this fall. Our hope is that as Lovel46 celebrates its 10th anniversary, you will join us in giving thanks to God for what He has done through our partnership together. We also wanted to provide you with a platform to talk as a church about God's heart for justice and mercy, proclaiming that even in the midst of gross injustice, He is making all things new.

Use this liturgy in its entirety and add your own sermon, or take pieces that could fit into your own worship service.

This liturgy is broken into three parts: Who is God? Who are we? Our response.

1. WHO IS GOD?

Welcome / Call to Worship

(Who is God? The One who heals, rescues, saves, redeems. Introduce that as part of the service you will be celebrating and giving thanks with Lovel46)

Responsive Reading

Pastor: God, You are light. In You there is no darkness at all. (1 John 1:5).

ALL: May your Kingdom come and may your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Pastor: Lord, You are good to all. (Psalm 145:9).

Pastor: God, you work all things for the good of those who love You, who have been called according to Your purpose. (Romans 8:28)

Pastor: For You are the LORD and You love justice. (Isaiah 61:8).

Pastor: God, You proclaim good news to the poor. You bind up the brokenhearted; You proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners. (Isaiah 61:1).

ALL: May your Kingdom come and may your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Pastor: Lord, your mercies are new every morning. Great is your faithfulness. (Lamentations 3:23) ALL: May your Kingdom come and may your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Pastor: God, your heart is for the widow and the orphan. (James 1:27)

ALL: May your Kingdom come and may your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Pastor: God, You are not just loving, but You are love. (1 John 4:8)

ALL: May your Kingdom come and may your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Pastor: God, You are not deaf to our prayers. (Matthew 7:7).

ALL: May your Kingdom come and may your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Pastor: God, we know that every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from You, the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows. (James 1:17).

ALL: May your Kingdom come and may your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Pastor: When Your disciples asked You to teach them to pray, these are the words you gave them and these are the words we will now say together as one....

ALL: Our Father, Who art in heaven. Hallowed be Thy name. Thy Kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation. But deliver us from evil. For thine is the Kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Invitation to Confession

In Exodus 3, The LORD says, "I have indeed seen the misery of my people in Egypt. I have heard them crying out because of their slave drivers, and I am concerned about their suffering. So I have come down to rescue them from the hand of the Egyptians...And... "now the cry of the Israelites has reached me, and I have seen the way the Egyptians are oppressing them. So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt."

We encounter a God concerned for the helpless, the poor and the weak and a God who empowers humans for justice and mercy to set the oppressed free. While we may desire true freedom for all people, we have, through omission or commission, turned a blind eye to injustice and the evil of human trafficking. Therefore, let us turn to God and confess our sins together.

Confession

Lord, you have created each one of us in your own image. We confess that we have allowed your image to be distorted in the lives of many who are victims of injustice and trafficked both in our country and in others, forced for labor and subject to exploitation, losing the right to live fully - a life of dignity and worth. We have allowed for injustice through our ignorance and insensitivity. Please forgive us, and by the power of Spirit fill us with true compassion and love to do everything within our means and by your power to see that they are set free. Amen.

Assurance of Grace

God Almighty you are merciful. You forgive us for all our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ. You strengthen our desire to work for justice. Your Spirit gives us courage to speak for the voiceless and to stand for the oppressed. Praise be to God, the Father, Jesus, the son and to the Holy Spirit who dwells in the hearts of those who love you.
